



NOTICE OF PUBLIC HEARING BEFORE THE MONTANA DEPARTMENT OF ENVIRONMENTAL QUALITY (DEQ)

A public hearing for the Drinking Water and the Water Pollution Control State Revolving Fund Loan Programs will be held in Helena Friday, June 15, 2018, at 10:30 a.m., in the Metcalf Building (1520 East Sixth Ave.), Room 111.

The public hearing will be held to consider Proposed Project Priority Lists and Intended Use Plans for State Fiscal Year 2019 for both SRF programs. The Intended Use Plans identify the intended uses of funds in the loan programs and describe how the goals of the programs will be satisfied. The Project Priority Lists identify projects that are eligible to be funded with loan monies authorized and appropriated to the State of Montana through Federal Fiscal Year 2019.

These comments must be **received by 5:00 p.m., Tuesday, July 3, 2018**. In addition, communities wanting to add their proposed drinking water or water pollution control projects to either Project Priority List should contact DEQ prior to the hearing date.
