Fall Construction Site Update

November 2018


Montana DEQ will begin demolition work in late November or early December to prepare the Montana Pole & Treating Plant Superfund Site for future work.

The project bid has been awarded to Mungas Company, Inc., of Philipsburg, and a Notice to Proceed with construction is expected to be issued in late November or early December. Construction is expected to be finished within 55 days of the Notice to Proceed.

Heavy equipment will be on the Site to remove asphalt paving, concrete vaults and pads, pipe, outbuildings and other infrastructure that is no longer used.

Contaminated materials will be stored in the former Land Treatment Unit on the east end of the Site and disposed of next year. DEQ does not anticipate any significant odors, dust or other disruptions from the work. Please don't hesitate to contact the DEQ project team with any construction-related questions or concerns.

A public meeting on plans for the next year's cleanup at the Montana Pole Site is anticipated this winter. Watch for details to come.
