- The notice below must be published no earlier than 10 days prior to the date your application will be submitted to DEQ, and no later than 10 days following the date of submittal.
- The notice is to be published in the legal notice section of a newspaper of general circulation in the area affected. Please contact DEQ with questions regarding an appropriate newspaper.
- Do not return this form.
- Submit a copy of the published notice(s) to the division with the application, if possible, or as soon thereafter as possible.

This notice is required by ARM Title 17, Chapter 8, Subchapter 6, Rule ARM 17.8.614 Commercial Film Production Open Burning Permits.

Any comments on the application must be submitted to DEQ within 20 days after publication of this notice or filing of the application, whichever is later. DEQ's decision to approve or deny an application for a conditional open burning permit may be reviewed by the Board of Environmental Review (Board) according to the following procedure:

When DEQ approves or denies the application for a conditional open burning permit under this section, a person who is jointly or severally adversely affected by DEQ's decision may request, within 15 days after the DEQ renders its decision, upon affidavit setting forth the grounds therefor, a hearing before the Board. A hearing shall be held under the provisions of the Montana Administrative Procedures Act.

DEQ's decision on the application is not final unless 15 days have elapsed and there is no request for a hearing under this section. The filing of a request for a hearing postpones the effective date of DEQ's decision until the conclusion of the hearing and issuance of a final decision by the Board.
