CHAIR RUFFATTO: Can you hear me? I want to say that $I$ have asked Vice Chair Aguirre to chair this meeting because I'm not feeling well, and so I'm going to turn it over to her to conduct the meeting. Thank you, and thank you, Stacy.

VICE CHAIR AGUIRRE: You bet. Welcome. I'm going to roll through this the best that $I$ can in Chairman Ruffatto's place. I just want to let everybody know $I$ probably expect this meeting to last for a couple hours. That's the thought.

And so I'll call the meeting to order, and the first order of business is to call for a roll, if you would, please, Sandy.

MR. RUSSELL: Sure. So this matter, the MEIC versus Signal Peak, is on judicial review. There was a motion to dismiss that was fully briefed, and relatively recently decided by the Court, and that was denied, and the parties were directed to file answers.

The Board's plan at this point is to file a motion to dismiss of its own, consistent with its position in other cases that it's not a proper party to matters on judicial review, and that actually is set to be filed today.

VICE CHAIR AGUIRRE: Thank you for that update.

CHAIR RUFFATTO: If I could add to that. VICE CHAIR AGUIRRE: Chair Ruffatto. CHAIR RUFFATTO: If I could add to that, if you recall at the last meeting, we talked about the possibility of just filing a notice of non-participation, but when Mike talked to Amy Christensen handling the Supreme Court appeal, she felt that that would hurt our case on appeal.

So consistent with the motion that was passed, Board Counsel was directed to do whatever it takes to protect the Board's interests, and it was decided that it was necessary to file a motion to dismiss to protect the Board's interests.

VICE CHAIR AGUIRRE: Thank you, Chairman Ruffatto.

MR. RUSSELL: I have no other updates on that.

VICE CHAIR AGUIRRE: Okay. Any further updates or discussion on Page 3 items?

VICE CHAIR AGUIRRE: Moving to the new contested case, appeal, and request for hearing by Westmoreland Rosebud Mining regarding issuance of

MPDES Permit No. MT0032042, Colstrip, Montana, BER 2022-06 WQ.

The Board decision here is to decide whether to hear the case itself, or assign a Hearing Examiner for some or the totality of the case, and I'd like to make a motion that we assign a Hearing Examiner for the totality of the case, and assign that to Michael Russell.

BOARD MEMBER SIMPSON: Second.
VICE CHAIR AGUIRRE: Is there any discussion on that? Chairman Ruffatto.

CHAIR RUFFATTO: I'm sorry. I forgot my hand up.

VICE CHAIR AGUIRRE: Oh, okay. Is there any discussion by the Board on this matter?
(No response)
VICE CHAIR AGUIRRE: Hearing none, I'll call for a vote on the motion. All in favor, say aye.
(Response)
VICE CHAIR AGUIRRE: All opposed.
(No response)
VICE CHAIR AGUIRRE: Motion carries.
Moving to the Board Counsel update. Michael.
MR. RUSSELL: Thank you, Vice Chair

Aguirre. My primary update is my presentation to the Water Policy Interim Committee at the State Legislature a couple weeks ago following the Board's last meeting, where the motion on DEQ's pending motion to amend was not passed.

There were many questions as to why, including from the press, and so $I$ responded to those. And I attended the committee meeting, and explained what happened essentially, which was that the Board had discussed and considered the pending motion, and held a vote on it, there were three votes in favor, two votes against, and that was insufficient to carry the motion pursuant to statute.

And that was the point that many were confused about, and for the record that particular statute is Montana Code Annotated Section 2-15-124(8) which states in part that a favorable vote of at least a majority of all members of a board is required to adopt any resolution, motion, or other decision unless otherwise provided by law.

So in considering that the Board has seven members, and there were only three in favor, that's not a majority, and the Board was not able
to pass the motion.
So that's the essence of my presentation to the interim committee. Members of the committee then expressed frustration at the Board's lack of progress on this particular matter, and that was in the context of their work, which was to put together a report on the selenium standards that they've been working on.

They've been tracking the Board's work on this particular case in relation to that report that they intend to present to the Legislature at the next session. So that makes sense that they're paying attention to what we were doing, but $I$ reiterated that the Board is constrained by statute like any other governmental entity, and that is what we were left with, and that's essentially the conclusion that $I$ had conveyed to them.

I also reminded them that the Board is comprised of volunteer members, and that has inherent constraints of its own.

So that was the primary, that was the gist of my comments to the committee. Now that the Board has made a decision on this particular matter, it's not clear to me whether they will
include that in their report.
After my comments and the committee's consideration, there were two subsequent votes on how to proceed that did not pass due to dead lock, so I believe the committee will proceed in submitting their report without the Board's findings.

VICE CHAIR AGUIRRE: Is that prudent?
MR. RUSSELL: That's not for me to decide. I suspect that they're paying attention to this meeting also, and they should be aware of the Board's decision, and $I$ don't see any reason why the Legislature would not have that information in considering how to proceed with their business come the next session.

Aside from that, we've already discussed the Board's activities, or the Board's position on pending judicial review matter in the Signal Peak case, and $I$ intend to proceed accordingly. I believe that's all $I$ have unless the Board has specific questions for me.

VICE CHAIR AGUIRRE: Do any members of the Board have any questions for Counsel?

VICE CHAIR AGUIRRE: Moving to the
