We'll start with the administrative items, review and approve the 8 minutes from August 23, 2024. Is there a motion? 9 10 BOARD MEMBER SMITH: Motion to approve. BOARD MEMBER RANKOSKY: 11 Second. 12 CHAIR SIMPSON: A motion has been made 13 and seconded to approve the minutes of the August 14 meeting. All in favor, say aye. 15 (Response) 16 CHAIR SIMPSON: Opposed. 17 (No response) 18 CHAIR SIMPSON: Motion carries. 19 minutes are approved. The next item is the 2025 20 Board calendar. 21 BOARD MEMBER RANKOSKY: Move to approve. 22 CHAIR SIMPSON: Excuse me. We have a 23 motion to approve? Is that what that was? 24 sorry.

BOARD MEMBER RANKOSKY:

Yes.

CHAIR SIMPSON: We have a motion. Is there a second?

BOARD MEMBER KNUTESON: I second that motion.

CHAIR SIMPSON: It's been moved and seconded to approve the 2025 schedule. Before proceeding with the vote, I did want to point out that I had asked Sandy to move up the December meeting to move it a little further away from the holidays, and I wanted to be sure you're all aware of that. If there are other thoughts on that, now would be the time to discuss them.

It seemed like anytime in December there are going to be potential conflicts with holiday activities, but anyway, any thoughts on that?

Agree, disagree, rather return it to the 19th?

CHAIR SIMPSON: Hearing no further discussion, it's been moved and seconded to approve the Board meeting schedule for 2025. All in favor, say aye.

CHAIR SIMPSON: Opposed.

25 CHAIR SIMPSON: Motion carries. Let's

proceed to the briefing items. Terisa, if you would walk us through this, please, and highlight the updates since the last meeting.

MS. OOMENS: Sure. So a lot of the updates are in the bold, like we had talked about during our last meeting.

But the one that I wanted to point out that didn't quite make it on here is we did get an updated stipulation from Alpine. I think it is noted that they would be bringing us a new stipulation, but they didn't get it to us in time to make it into the packet and the agenda.

So other than that, everything's moving forward. We still haven't gotten a remand in the Westmoreland case from the Montana District Court. We're hoping to get that eventually, but Judge Bidegaray did make it on the Supreme Court, and so I assume that that Montana District Court case will be assigned to a new Judge and we will get a remand from that new Judge.

Other than that, those are kind of the highlights. Happy to answer any questions if you have them.

CHAIR SIMPSON: Just a little further comment on that. I don't know what's happened to

my Zoom here, but I guess it's just because I'm kind of a luddite when it comes to computer programs.

One thing I did want to point out. On the DEQ versus the Board of Environmental Review and the related MEIC, et al., case, that of course is the selenium rule. The latest update shows that the briefing is to have started this month. There's been another one month schedule change on that, so the initial briefing will take place in mid-January 2025.

Just leafing through here. Terisa brought us up to date on Alpine. Are there any further comments or questions from the Board on any of the briefing items? I think it's all fairly straight forward. I'm trying to remind myself if I have any other questions, but I do not. Any other comments from the Board on briefing items?

CHAIR SIMPSON: General public comment,

CHAIR SIMPSON: Hearing none, we'll move to Item 5, the Board Chair update.

In your packages, we included a memo from the Chair regarding 2024 fiscal year legal expenses, along with a spreadsheet. This is simply a matter of information.

One of the things that -- and I guess this goes back to my background in business. I think it's important to have a recognition of what public funds are being expended on activities of the Board, and gives you a little insight as to

what the expense is with regard to contested cases, particularly if they go to hearing, because that's really where the time is spent.

So if there are any questions, I'd be happy to try to answer them, but this was strictly for your information. Any thoughts on it?

(No response)

CHAIR SIMPSON: I guess I would add to that. It's kind of hard to know where we're going if we don't know where we've been. So it's a good summary of the work that was completed last year.

I guess one of the more significant observations I had is that we had far more cases disposed of than we had new cases, which means our caseload is going down. So I'm not really sure what that means. Either the Department is doing a better job, or nothing's happening, or people aren't pay attention, one of the three. But I think it is a positive development certainly.

BOARD MEMBER AGUIRRE: I think this was a very insightful and valuable piece of information on our efforts and what goes into that, as far as time and as far as expenses.

BOARD MEMBER KNUTESON: I agree. I think --

CHAIR SIMPSON: It happened -- Sorry,

Amanda.

BOARD MEMBER KNUTESON: I was seconding Stacy's. I was just thanking you. I agree that was very helpful, especially for me as a newer Board member, to be able to see the kind of year in review and the resources that go into dealing with all of these matters.

And I don't want interrupt you or change the topic, but I think this might segue in. I don't know if the Board is aware. I was just scanning through legislative concepts and draft bills, and I saw that there is a proposal to eliminate the Board of Environmental Review, and two other proposals related to changing what we do, and topics we cover.

I just wanted to -- To the extent -- I don't know what the motivation behind that is.

I'll watch the hearings like everyone else. But I just think it's helpful seeing that summary of what the Board has been doing, and how much is expended on it.

And I don't know again if that ties in with the basis for this legislation or not, but I think that we as a Board should probably keep an

eye on that, and participate in these hearings. I think we should exist.

CHAIR SIMPSON: We certainly will keep an eye on it. And I was aware of the first, I guess it's a bill draft request at this point, with regard to elimination of the Board. I was not aware of the other two. I guess one thing we need to do is take a look at those. And I guess --

BOARD MEMBER ALTEMUS: Mr. Chair, I can give you the LC numbers if you want, but I think the question we need to ask ourselves, and what I kind of mentioned this morning, is that I'm not sure that we legally can weigh in. We can certainly watch, but I think we have to be really careful.

Because there are three right now, there could be more, and there's a whole bunch of opencut ones. So I just think we need to be careful about -- I will be in halls come January 6th, because of my job. So if somebody stops me in the hall on these things, I can't speak to it. So I think we need to be clear about that. Thank you, Amanda.

CHAIR SIMPSON: What are the LC numbers

on those, Julia? Do you have them handy?

BOARD MEMBER ALTEMUS: I do. So 646 -- I'm sorry. That's Opencut.

647 is to eliminate the Board; 648 is to revise what we do; and 649 is to revise how people appeal to the Board. Those are all Senator Ellis's LC's. And there could be more.

CHAIR SIMPSON: Okay. Well, there could be more, and probably will be more. I'm not sure what the motivation is behind these. I guess I can guess, but I'm not going to speculate.

I think -- and please correct me if I'm wrong, either Terisa or Legal Counsel for the Department -- but I believe that as Board members, we can provide informational testimony at a minimum. I'm not sure about our ability to take a position on this. I don't know where we stand.

MS. OOMENS: I will just throw in there.

Number one, we're assuming that any of this goes

anywhere. They could very well stop before we get

to a hearing or anything.

But number two, I would say we have to be very careful about whether we are acting on the Board's behalf or our own personal opinions on the matter. If something is said on the Board's

behalf, that needs to be approved by the Board and discussed previously. However, if you personally feel the need or the desire to go to these hearings and express your personal opinion on the

So at this point that's what I'll say, but just keep that in the back of your mind.

matter, you have the right to do so.

CHAIR SIMPSON: Terisa, could I ask you to repeat that, please? My internet connection cut out for a few seconds there.

MS. OOMENS: Sure. If you're going to, or if you want to go to these hearings, should there be one, and speak on the Board's behalf, we need to have Board approval to do so, and some kind of agreement on a statement of what's being said, or what information is being provided.

If you want to appear or go in a personal capacity, and express your own personal opinions on whether or not the Board should be affected in any manner, number one, make sure that that's clear that you're expressing your personal opinion, and number two, you have every right to do so.

CHAIR SIMPSON: Okay. Well, that clarifies it then. Thank you very much.

MS. OOMENS: You're welcome.

BOARD MEMBER ALTEMUS: Mr. Chair, can I ask one more question, please?

CHAIR SIMPSON: Yes. Please.

appreciated what you did with that report. I've never seen one. I've been on this Board now for several years. I've never seen that done. Can we get -- without too much effort, and if it's too much effort, I understand -- but it would be good to have a comparison to at least maybe the last couple of years, because I think that would be helpful going forward. Are we trending in the right direction or are we not? I think we are, but the proof would be to look back at what happened previous.

CHAIR SIMPSON: I guess I'd have to pose that question to Sandy, because she's the one that compiled all of this information at my request.

And so prior to the time that I took over as Chairman, I'm not sure what the availability of information would be. I know it's there somewhere, but how easy it might be to retrieve it, I don't know.

We are collecting it going forward, I

can say that, and assuming we're still here next year, we'll be repeating the process. Any thoughts on that, Sandy?

MS. MOISEY-SCHERER: As for costs, I'll have to look at the files and confer with Deputy Director Fehr to make sure I have everything correct.

BOARD MEMBER ALTEMUS: It's just a thought. I think it would be helpful to know if we've made improvements over the last three or four years, or if we're trending in the wrong direction.

CHAIR SIMPSON: Well, Sandy, why don't you discuss that in-house there, and we'll put it on the informational agenda for the next meeting, just to give us an idea what the options might be, if any.

BOARD MEMBER ALTEMUS: Thank you.

CHAIR SIMPSON: I believe we've already moved into Item B, General Board Business. That's really all I had. Anything further from the Board?

MS. OOMENS: I just had one question, just because it's fresh on everyone's mind. The way that -- getting you the briefing, and the

exhibits, and that kind of thing for this latest contested case, I just wanted to see how the facilitation of that this time went, compared to other times, if there's ways that we can make that easier or better for the Board. I just kind of wanted to get some input, because it was a little different than we had previously done, so --

CHAIR SIMPSON: Thank you, Terisa. And I guess from my own standpoint, I found it very helpful to have the briefing early so that we had some time to review it, and I guess everybody has a different way of looking at things, but it helps me to read it, and then come back to it later. And quite often if we get the stuff the same week, there isn't really time to study it all that much.

It raises another question, though, that I'd wanted to bring up, and this goes back to the discussion on the Board schedule. We have -- Terisa, you and I have discussed having the information package to Sandy by Wednesday of the week that it's supposed to come out to the Board.

And I don't know if we need a motion on that, but that would probably move your schedule forward as to when you need to have the information from all of the sources that compile

the information that goes into the Board agenda. So what are your thoughts on that?

MS. OOMENS: That is another thing that we tried to change this time around. I believe we did get the packet to Sandy by Wednesday this week. And so I think we are able to change that at this point without bumping back any of the other deadlines, but I guess we'll see as we go this year if that changes. But at this point, I think we're okay. Does that answer your question?

CHAIR SIMPSON: Yes, it answers my question. Thank you. But I think it is worthwhile to have the information in a day or two, at least a day, preferably two, before it has to go out to the Board.

BOARD MEMBER KNUTESON: I wanted to thank Terisa as well for amending the way that you provide that information. I like the direction you're going and really appreciate that.

CHAIR SIMPSON: Thank you, Amanda.

Anything further for the good of the order?
