CHAIR SIMPSON: I would like to observe the tradition of having lunch.

BOARD MEMBER RANKOSKY: I need to go to another meeting. I booked it out until one, but I didn't book it beyond that, so I would have to get out of here at one, thirteen minutes.

CHAIR SIMPSON: Any objection to continuing?

VICE CHAIR AGUIRRE: I'm with Jen.

Taking a break is not the best course of action

for me to be able to stay connected with the

meeting because of other obligations. I'll try to

-- I don't know how long this next part will go.

CHAIR SIMPSON: Well, I don't either.

And so why don't we -- It's not 12:47. Let's at least have a preliminary consideration of West Decker, and get an idea of where we're going with it, and then take a break at one.

BOARD MEMBER RANKOSKY: Will you guys be able to continue if I leave?

CHAIR SIMPSON: I'm sorry?

VICE CHAIR AGUIRRE: Will we have a

quorum?

BOARD MEMBER RANKOSKY: Will you be able to continue if I leave?

CHAIR SIMPSON: If we lose two members,

BOARD MEMBER RANKOSKY: Okay.

VICE CHAIR AGUIRRE: You won't lose me unless it goes a couple more hours. Then I may have to step out.

CHAIR SIMPSON: I have an important appointment with my son and grandson to go fishing that involves a six hour drive this afternoon, so I'd like to get things over with as well. Let's have a little bit of discussion of West Decker because I'm not really sure where we stand on it.

At our last meeting we had tabled East Decker, but had taken no action on West Decker, and I guess in hindsight that was probably an oversight because West Decker is under the same time constraints as East Decker.

That being said, we have received briefing from the parties on West Decker, and the question then is what are the preferences of the parties as far as proceeding with oral argument on West Decker, or is that issue not at a point where

it can be considered by the Board? I'll ask
Decker first.

MS. MARQUIS: Thank you, Chairman Simpson. Thank you also for agreeing to take up the West Decker matter at this meeting.

Our view is that on February 28th Decker filed a response letter to DEQ's order. Decker has not received a response to that yet. Decker, as you are aware, Decker filed its reply brief early this morning. So our position is that it would be best if the Board reviewed the briefs, and we took this up at a later time. Decker would be fine with that. If it gets sent to a Hearing Examiner, the same thing. So that's Decker's position at this time.

CHAIR SIMPSON: Thank you. Mr. King.

MR. KING: Thank you, Board Chair. I'll second Ms. Marquis that we're comfortable with putting off the hearing. DEQ will agree not to take any further action on that West Decker order at least until the parties have had an opportunity to complete reviewing the briefs, and opportunity to argue before you. So if we need to reschedule at a later date, that's fine.

CHAIR SIMPSON: What's the position of

the parties? Can this wait until our next regular meeting, or will we need another special meeting to deal with it? Because the deadline will have passed next Tuesday.

MR. KING: Board Chair Simpson, can I consult with our folks, and then how about -- I guess my proposal is I'll reach out to Ms.

Marquis, and then we can either request another special hearing if we're not in agreement, or if we think we can postpone it until the next regularly scheduled meeting.

My personal preference right now would be to just do it at the next regularly scheduled meeting, but I do recognize that's not until June.

CHAIR SIMPSON: Thank you. It sounds like we're in agreement then. We're not going to deal with this today. So any --

MR. KING: Actually so the deadline for West is for July, so we're not under the same sort of pressure here. And so DEQ is comfortable pushing that out until the next meeting, if that's amenable to Decker and the Board.

MS. MARQUIS: Decker is fine with that as well.

CHAIR SIMPSON: Well, in that case,

we're ready for adjournment. Is there a motion? 1 2 MS. OOMENS: I'm sorry, Chair. Before we do that, can we just have a motion to hear 3 4 Decker West at the next regular Board meeting, 5 just so we clear up kind of the sequence of events here? 6 7 CHAIR SIMPSON: Is there a motion? VICE CHAIR AGUIRRE: I'll make a motion 8 9 that we move the matter regarding West Decker to 10 our next regularly scheduled Board meeting. 11 CHAIR SIMPSON: Thank you. Is there a 12 second? 13 BOARD MEMBER RANKOSKY: Second. 14 CHAIR SIMPSON: It's been moved and 15 seconded to move West Decker to our next regularly 16 scheduled Board meeting which will be in June. 17 Discussion. 18 (No response) 19 CHAIR SIMPSON: All in favor, say aye. 20 (Response) 21 CHAIR SIMPSON: Opposed. 22 (No response) 23 CHAIR SIMPSON: Motion carries. 24 you, everyone. It's been a rather intense meeting

at times, but well worth our time, I believe.
