agenda this morning. I think it's going to be an interesting meeting. But before we proceed, I would like to welcome our newest Board member Allan Payne who replaces Amanda on the Board who was not reappointed. I would like to take a minute for the Board Members to just kind of go around the table and introduce ourselves in just a couple of sentences.

I'm Dave Simpson. I live in Yellowstone
County just about a couple of miles from the
Billings city limit. My background briefly, I'm
retired. I worked in the coal industry for
approximately 40 years, including 34 years with
Westmoreland Coal doing environmental permitting
and reclamation planning, and then a couple years
in consulting. I fill the natural scientist slot
on the Board. Vice Chair Aguirre.

VICE CHAIR AGUIRRE: I'm Stacy Aguirre.

I live in Glendive, Montana. I fill the public

representative, one of the public representative positions. My background is I'm an engineer from Montana Tech, and have worked in the energy industry in some fashion since graduating from Montana Tech, and am still working providing environmental services to the oil and gas industry.

CHAIR SIMPSON: Thank you, Stacy. Joe.

BOARD MEMBER SMITH: I'm Joe Smith.

I've been on the Board now for, this is my second term, so I think about six years or so. I'm from Ravalli County. I'm also a Montana Tech graduate, a civil engineer by trade; worked in mostly water resources engineering for about ten years in Montana, and then have been in the utility sector working for both electric co-ops, and now I'm employed by a telecommunications company in Hamilton, Montana; and also have served on the Ravalli County Planning Board for about ten years now.

BOARD MEMBER ALTEMUS: Good morning, everybody. Julia Altemus. I'm in Missoula. I've been on the Board since 2021. I also represent

the public representative on the Board.

CHAIR SIMPSON:

My background, as I am still working, but spent 14 years working as a staffer to the US Senate in Energy and Natural Resources, and have been working on behalf and for the Montana timber community for the last 38 years; maybe will retire at some point soon, but that's kind of my background is energy and natural resources, and again, I represent the public representative on the Board. Thank you.

CHAIR SIMPSON: Thank you, Julia.

BOARD MEMBER PAYNE: My name is Allan

Payne. I am too also a graduate of Montana Tech

some many years ago. I am an attorney at law, but

I am at this point mostly retired. And I am new

to the Board. Actually I'm originally from Libby,

where my family was involved -- where my family

were loggers, but I now live in Helena.

CHAIR SIMPSON: Thank you, Allan. Once again, welcome to the Board. I trust everyone enjoyed their 473 page reading assignment for this meeting. I know I sure did. I also would like to introduce Dana Hupp who is assisting us as interim Board Counsel since the last meeting. Dana, would you like to say a few words.

MS. HUPP: Good morning. I'm excited to 1 2 be asked to be interim Board Counsel. I am 3 currently living in Missoula. I'm a Ohio native, 4 but have been in Missoula for about 25 years now. 5 So I look forward to this opportunity. CHAIR SIMPSON: Thank you, Dana. 6 7 miss anyone? (No response) 8 CHAIR SIMPSON: I don't think so. 9 Well, 10 let's proceed with the August 22nd meeting 11 minutes. Are there any comments or alterations to 12 the minutes? 13 (No response) 14 CHAIR SIMPSON: Is there a motion? 15 BOARD MEMBER ALTEMUS: I move to approve the minutes. 16 17 BOARD MEMBER SMITH: I'll second. 18 CHAIR SIMPSON: Thank you, Julia. It's 19 been moved and seconded to approve the August 22 20 meeting minutes. Any further discussion? 21 BOARD MEMBER PAYNE: Mr. Chairman, I'm 22 going to abstain from the vote because I wasn't at 23 the meeting, so I can't really vote to approve it 24 if I wasn't there.

CHAIR SIMPSON: Thank you, Allan.

CHAIR SIMPSON: I heard three. Was there a --

VICE CHAIR AGUIRRE: I think I might need to abstain as well since I wasn't on the meeting call. I did read through them. I don't have any issues with them.

CHAIR SIMPSON: I guess we may be at a little bit of a dilemma because that brings us down to three votes which isn't a quorum. So I guess --

VICE CHAIR AGUIRRE: Can I vote? Can Allan vote?

BOARD MEMBER PAYNE: Yes. We can vote to approve it. I just thought I shouldn't, but I don't think there's a requirement that we have to abstain. So I vote -- if everyone here -- if those are a proper reflection of what happened at the meeting, then I would vote to approve as well.

VICE CHAIR AGUIRRE: I agree. I vote to approve as well.

CHAIR SIMPSON: Okay. Thank you very much. Motion carries, unanimously I believe.

Moving ahead, normally what we do at

this time is go through the briefing items, and I'll have one comment on that, but I think the cases that are of most interest to us we'll be

making decisions on under action items.

But one thing I did want to point out is that there has been one new development since the Board packages were sent out, and that is that on October 15th, we received an order from the District Court on the Gateway Conservation Alliance case. This is the opencut mining permit just outside of Gallatin Gateway, and this is a case that the Board had elected to assume jurisdiction.

The order was in response to a motion for dismissal from DEQ. That motion was granted, and so this case comes back to the Board. As I said, we didn't have enough time to include this in the Board package, but if you recall, the Board had stayed the proceedings in the interim while this case played out in court, and the parties have been directed to file a status report within thirty days of issuance of a decision from the Montana District Court, so that's what we'll expect to receive next on that case.

The same is true on the Gallatin County

Community Coalition. This is the second gravel pit case in Gallatin County. I'm not entirely certain where that project is located. I haven't looked at the petition. But again, that case was stayed in response to the filing by the petitioners in District Court, and so that stay will ultimately be lifted as well.

I think, I guess I would ask Counsel if, for the sake of proper procedure, whether we should hold off until the next meeting before lifting the stay. I'm inclined to wait until we get the status reports from the parties.

MS. MOISEY-SCHERER: Chairman Simpson, this is Sandy. Sam King has his hand up.

CHAIR SIMPSON: As usual I can't see all of the participants here. Thank you, Sam. Please go ahead.

MR. KING: Good morning, Board Chair and Board members. Can everybody hear me okay?

CHAIR SIMPSON: Yes.

MR. KING: I thought I would chime in here on this case. Both the concrete materials case and the TMC Black Site case, we are preparing a status report for the Board.

One thing I would like to flag, however,

is that there hasn't been entry of judgment in that District Court case yet, so while that disposed of the claims in that case, until there's an entry of judgment, the time for appeal to the Montana Supreme Court doesn't start running. I'm not aware if plaintiffs in that case will intend to appeal that to the Montana Supreme Court, but that might dictate whether or not it's of interest to the Board to keep this case stayed or not.

So this is a long way of saying that it might be in the Board's best interests to just hold off on making a decision of whether to lift that stay or not until the next Board meeting.

CHAIR SIMPSON: Thank you, Sam. Sandy.

MS. MOISEY-SCHERER: Chair Simpson, this is Sandy again. Kim Wilson has his hand up.

MR. WILSON: Mr. Chairman, can you hear me?

CHAIR SIMPSON: Yes, I can.

MR. WILSON: I just wanted to say I concur in what Mr. King just said. We're not sure yet if we're going to appeal that case which prompted the stay here. And so I guess I would agree with Mr. King that that decision to lift the stay can wait.

And I guess also to say -- and I don't remember if that order of the stay -- I guess that did say that we would report within thirty days, and we're happy to do that. But because of the stay the parties -- appeal time will be longer than the usual thirty days, the appeal deadline.

CHAIR SIMPSON: Thank you very much.

This was not an agenda item, so I don't feel that
we should be making any decisions on it just yet.

I think it would be premature. So any other
comments from the Board or from Board Counsel?

BOARD MEMBER ALTEMUS: Chairman Simpson, not in relation to this, but normally before we move in, we have DEQ identify who is in the meeting. So some names that are here I don't recognize. When we're done with this topic, can we do introductions first before we move forward?

CHAIR SIMPSON: Yes, let's do that,
please. I overlooked that. I apologize. Thank
you very much. Are there any further comments on
this subject? I don't think we need a motion.
Since it's not on the agenda, we'll just hold off
until the matter plays out.

CHAIR SIMPSON: Sandy, could we review

for the record who's on the call in addition to the Board members and Counsel.

MS. MOISEY-SCHERER: Yes, sir. My name is Sandy Moisey-Scherer, I'm the Board secretary for the Board. Laurie Crutcher is on the call, she's the Court Reporter. We have Sam King from DEQ; Vicki Marquis; Kim Wilson; Sam Yemington; Kirsten Bowers; Sarah Bordelon; Shiloh Hernandez; Deputy Director Fehr; Alan Ringlein; Amanda Galvan; Andrea Grave; Catherine Armstrong; Aurora Goddard; Brian Schrage; Emily Lodman; Isabelle Neville; Jeremiah Langston; Josh Bridgeman; Kurt Moser; Lee; Mitch; Mitch Hoffman; Ric Casteel. And I believe that's all on the call.

CHAIR SIMPSON: We have a lot of interest this morning. I guess I'm not surprised with what we have on our agenda. You have to excuse me. I've got a big pile of paper on my desk here, and sometimes I have trouble figuring out where I need to be.

MS. MOISEY-SCHERER: Chair Simpson, this is Sandy. Before we go into the other items, we have not talked about the 2026 meeting calendar.

CHAIR SIMPSON: Right. That's the next.

I'm sorry. We did jump ahead a little bit. The

Board calendar was included in the Board package.

Normally that comes out in December, but Sandy had it prepared, and we thought it would be best to include it in this agenda, so that you can take a look at it, and see if you would like to make any

I think we'll hold off on a vote on that until December, but are there any of the Board meeting dates that create a conflict for anyone at this point that you know of? I'd just add to that I don't know what I'm doing next week, let alone next year, so it's kind of hard to say.

MS. MOISEY-SCHERER: Chair Simpson, Vice Chair Aguirre has her hand up.

CHAIR SIMPSON: Stacy.

changes or alterations.

VICE CHAIR AGUIRRE: Yes. I was just wondering if Board Member Altemus's question was actually answered on what -- I think you specifically asked about who from DEQ is on the call. Are you good with the naming of the people, or do you want to know specifically who's representing DEQ?

BOARD MEMBER ALTEMUS: Thanks, Board

Member Aguirre. Normally we get identification as

to who they are representing, and not just their

names. I can see their names, but I don't know who they're representing. And some people I recognize and some people I don't, so that was kind of my question. Thank you. I was going to let it go, but thank you for bringing that back up again.

CHAIR SIMPSON: I think -- I'm sure we have a number of attorneys and representatives of petitioners in addition to DEQ on this call because there are several cases that this Board is going to decide what direction we're going to go.

And I guess if it would be the Board's preference, we can identify who is being represented here. I believe that will come out as we go through the cases, and there will be comments from the parties I'm sure. Anything further, Julia? Would you prefer to go back, or what are your thoughts?

BOARD MEMBER ALTEMUS: No, thank you,
Chairman. I think as people speak, if they would
identify who they're representing that would be
helpful, instead of just launching in. That would
be great. So I know who they're representing, if
they can do that, instead of going back through
again. Thanks.

CHAIR SIMPSON: Thank you very much.

Sandy, have I missed anything else before going

3 into action items?

MS. MOISEY-SCHERER: No, sir.

CHAIR SIMPSON: Well, before we go into the action items, I would like to bring the Board Chair Update forward. That's normally one of the last things we discuss, but I think the topics there may very well enter into our consideration and discussion of the various cases that we're looking at.

The first item there is Board discussion regarding managing new cases going forward. I guess I would comment that we've been faced with a significant problem or challenge here because we've lost our Hearing Examiners from the Department of Justice, as well as Rob Cameron, who was handling several cases as outside Hearing Examiner.

And I guess the way I feel about that right now is quite often a problem is just a cleverly disguised opportunity, and I think that's the case here. I think we're fortunate in the timing here because we have a relatively low number of cases that we need to make some

decisions on how we proceed going forward.

But it occurred to me in going through all of this, this has been an opportunity for me to really get back into looking at these active cases -- where we stand, how we got where we are -- and it raised a question in my mind as to whether the Board's way of operating here has been something that we might consider modifying somewhat.

And the reason I say that is when the cases come to us, at least in my experience on the Board over the last five years or so, is that it's been an automatic decision with a couple of exceptions to assign them to a Hearing Examiner without really knowing what the cases are about. And it's become pretty obvious that not all of the cases that come to the Board automatically go through the contested case hearing process, they take a number of different courses depending on how the parties approach the case.

So what I want to suggest just as a general thought is that the Board might consider taking jurisdiction on the new cases as they come to us; and then later going through the procedural, initial procedural steps, which is the

prehearing order, and discovery, and those items that take place leading up to the scheduling of a hearing; and then at some point, once the case has defined itself, for the Board to decide whether this is something that it wants to maintain jurisdiction on or whether we want to assign it to a Hearing Examiner.

Obviously some of these cases that go to contested case hearing, the hearings are several days long, and I don't think this Board is prepared to spend that kind of time on the hearings.

So if you look, the second item under the Board Chair's comments has to do with the initial prehearing order, and included in your package is a template that we put together to guide the process from the beginning. This is not too much different from previous versions of it.

What we did was take a look at a typical prehearing order, and went through, and made a few minor changes in it.

But I'd like to call your attention to

Page 8 of that order where it says "on or before,"

whatever the appropriate date is, "the parties

shall prepare and file preliminary prehearing

statements which include statement of facts, contentions of law, list of proposed stipulated facts, preliminary witness list other than experts, a proposed exhibit list, the party's requested relief," and a list of potential prehearing motions and list of legal issues capable of prehearing resolution. We might also want to add to that statement of issues or claims.

And I guess what I would suggest is that this might be an appropriate point for the Board to review the status of the case, and make that decision as to whether it's appropriate to retain jurisdiction or to assign it to a Hearing Examiner. And as we go through these action items on our active cases, I think this is a question that is going to come up.

So I wanted to just cover that briefly before we get into the action items, and so before we get to the specific cases, are there any thoughts from the Board on the topic of how the Board proceeds with cases as they come before us? Any comments from the Board?

BOARD MEMBER PAYNE: Being the newest member, I have to speak here with a little humility because I don't have the history the

other members have here.

But in looking at the cases,
particularly the Westmoreland case that we're
going to be talking about later, it seems to me
that, for example, there's a statutory and
administrative rule requirement in that particular
case that the hearing be initiated within thirty
days of the petition submission, and obviously
that didn't happen in this case.

And I think the Board can be faced with these sort of "How do we do all of those deadlines?," and it may well -- An order that we have here might be appropriate, depending on what type of challenges, you know, what permit is being challenged, or denial of permit is challenged, or what declaratory ruling is being asked of us.

There may need to be at some point different pretrial orders that take into account the statutory time frames that the Board is supposed to be, should be observing. But I don't want to get too far, too advanced in that, because obviously there's an immediate need here with the Hearings Officers having been, you know, Agency Legal Services having been taken away. We may need to have a --

Maybe we adopt this general rule, but it might be at some appropriate time to maybe have a subcommittee really look at all of the various types of permits, because the challenges that can come to the Board, and different challenges may be subject to different preliminary orders or different procedures. So that may be something we want to look at in the future, but I think this order here is a great start, but it may not be one size fits all.

CHAIR SIMPSON: That's certainly the case, and thank you very much, Allan. I guess I would comment further that there are some cases that obviously would need to go directly to a Hearing Examiner, and what I'm talking about are challenges to, for example, coal mining permits. We've had several of those, and inevitably those cases go through the full contested case process.

There are others, including a couple that are before us today as examples, that don't necessarily take that route, depending on the nature of the issues and the nature of the petition.

So the prehearing order, at least as I see it, is a way to kind of get the ball rolling,

and sort out just what course that case is going to take, and that's why I'm bringing forward the suggestion, and that's all it is, that the Board may want to proceed internally with the initial procedures until the case can be a little bit more clearly defined as to what direction it's going to go.

This is a way for the Board to take a more active role. Once we assign a case to a Hearing Examiner, the substance of the case no longer comes under the jurisdiction of the Board, and so we hear nothing about it. All we see are what amount to monthly status reports as to whether there have been any new filings or new actions taken in these various cases. Other thoughts?

MS. MOISEY-SCHERER: Chair Simpson, Vice Chair Aguirre has her hand up.

CHAIR SIMPSON: Yes, thanks. Stacy.

VICE CHAIR AGUIRRE: So based on what you said, and what Allan added, for me as a Board member, one thing that I feel has been missing is really an upfront understanding, and you spoke to this, Chairman Simpson, and so did Board Member Payne.

We need to have an upfront understanding of the issues, and that seems to be lacking, as you have said, Chairman Simpson, in the process. The fact that that seems to be lacking upfront is a more true understanding of really what is at issue, has made it confusing to figure out how to proceed, or how to think about it, or even what our options are to handle it.

Because sometimes we may want to say,

"Okay. This seems like it could be solved easier

if," A, B, C, but sometimes it will be, "This is a

little more complicated, and so we need to take

that route." So kind of matching up what both

you, Chair Simpson and Board Member Payne

presented in thoughts is almost to me like even

one step further than what has to happen first, in

that we have to kind of have to have a true

understanding of what's at issue, because we --

Like Board Member Payne said, one size doesn't fit all, and that seems -- That one statement to me hit a chord, because that is a lot of the issues a lot of times, even with these cases, is that you're trying to do one size fits all, and they have some uniqueness even if they're a more simple debate, or issue, or matter.

So it almost seems like the process that we have had since I've been on the Board almost complicates it more from our ability to do our job as Board members, and really truly have the kind of input that we need to have on these cases.

So I guess in summary, it feels like part of what you presented, Chairman Simpson, was right on the mark, in that we really need to have an understanding of the matter, but I feel like that is a more upfront necessity than even somewhere kind of down the line, even a small distance down the line.

I'm not sure if that's exactly making sense, but that's been the challenge for me as a Board member is to kind of want to know right upfront, "Why is this here?," like more simply.
"Why is this here?"

CHAIR SIMPSON: Well, I guess you've framed exactly what has been on my mind, is that I've been very frustrated with the fact that we get these cases, and we assign them to a Hearing Examiner. We do see the initial petitions, and the initial petition might be 20 pages or it might be a letter. We don't really at that point have any means of sorting out what the issues, how the

issues are going to unfold.

VICE CHAIR AGUIRRE: Exactly.

CHAIR SIMPSON: Thank you. Thank you, Stacy. Julia, any thoughts?

BOARD MEMBER ALTEMUS: No. Thanks for the conversation. I agree with everything that's being said, so I think the more information we have, I think there are decisions we can make in general. So yes. Thanks.

CHAIR SIMPSON: Joe.

BOARD MEMBER SMITH: I'm in agreement with Julia. I agree with everything that's been said. I'd appreciate little bit more substance upfront. I honestly feel like what you put together here somewhat puts into words how we've been operating the last few Board meetings anyway, because I feel like we had a little bit more substance into these cases upfront. We've even kept some of them on our docket a little bit longer. So I think what you've done has kind of just formalized how we've been operating the last few Board meetings.

CHAIR SIMPSON: Thank you, Joe. I guess
I'd like to comment then. I don't know if the
other Board members are aware of this, but one of

the things that I've learned, and I guess I kind of knew it in the back of my mind but never took advantage of it, is that Sandy, the Board secretary, has the docket for each of these cases, which is a list of filings which also connects to the filings themselves.

And in reviewing these cases that we're working on, Dana and I have gone through a lot of that, and frankly spent quite a bit of time on it just to get a good handle on where we are. But those records are available to the Board members if you want to take advantage of it.

And also I think going forward, for those cases that the Board has retained jurisdiction on either permanently or temporarily, it would probably be a good idea for the Board members to be copied in on those filings as they come in, and Sandy and I will talk about that and work out a process, assuming we go that direction. Further thoughts?

(No response)

CHAIR SIMPSON: Again, have I missed anyone? I don't think so. Let's move forward to the four cases that are before us. What we need to do here is to decide whether to assign these to

a Hearing Examiner, or whether to retain jurisdiction either permanently or temporarily.

And I guess in practical terms, anytime the Board assumes jurisdiction, it is temporary until we decide, permanent until we decide otherwise or vice versa.

The first case is -- see if I've got this right. The first case is case Westmoreland Absaloka. It's a water quality case, BER 2015-06. This has been going on for ten years. And if you recall at the last Board meeting, the petitioners had filed a second petition in this case having to do with the most recent renewal of that permit.

We held a status conference on October 6th, and the parties I think have filed a joint motion, stipulation, to stay the proceedings for the next 15 to 30 days. The parties appear to be cautiously optimistic that they can reach a negotiated resolution.

The recommendation, and this recommendation for discussion is that BER retain jurisdiction, take no further action at this time, other than to stay this case at the request of the parties. I believe that's -- I've got so much paper on my desk I'm having a hard time keeping up

with things. But let me just sort this out.

We do have it. On October 10th -- This is in the Board packet. "On October 10th, 2025, the parties filed a joint motion for a stay to allow the parties time to evaluate and propose a joint resolution. The Board or Hearing Examiner will need to rule on that joint motion for stay."

So the recommendation is to issue a stay to give the parties time to try to sort this out, and come to a settlement, and to retain jurisdiction. Is there a motion from the Board so that we can move forward with discussion, if any?

On September 19th, 2025 the parties filed a joint status report with the Board. The matter is currently stayed. The DEQ was to make a final determination to renew or modify the permit by October 20th, 2025. Alpine Pacific is to move to dismiss this appeal within thirty days of DEQ's

final permit decision. Alpine may then request a new contested case hearing to appeal DEQ's final permit decision.

So I guess the first question for the parties is: Has DEQ issued its final decision?

And has there been any further developments in this case? Ms. Bowers.

MS. BOWERS: Yes, Chair Simpson, members of the Board. DEQ did issue a final permit and that was effective October 1st, 2025. So we're still within the thirty days for Alpine to file a motion to dismiss, but they didn't comment on the draft permit, so I fully expect this will be dismissed by your next Board meeting. And Alpine is represented by Rick Tappan, and I don't believe he's on the call today.

CHAIR SIMPSON: Well, thank you very much. I think then that we can retain jurisdiction in this case for the time being, and revisit it at our next meeting once the process has played out. I don't believe we need any action by the Board. Do we, Dana, or do we?
