### **SUMMARY Supplement Appendix D-4**

### **Explanation of how funding request fits into Beneficiary's Mitigation Plan (5.2.1)**

DEQ set aside approximately 10% of the funds, or \$1.26 million to be available for eligible vehicle upgrades and replacements based on level of interest and demand due to vehicle technology advancements and other factors as authorized under Eligible Mitigation Actions 1-4, 6-8, & 10.

Detailed Description of Mitigation Action Item Including Community and Air Quality Benefits (5.2.2) Montana DEQ solicited applications from public and private entities across Montana to partially reimburse the replacement and scrapping of projects authorized under Eligible Mitigation Actions 1, 2, 6 & 7. One application for an electric baggage tractor was received from the Missoula County Airport Authority (MSO). MSO owns and operates airport ground support equipment that are eligible for replacement under EMA7. Trust funds will help MSO replace one gasoline baggage tractor with a battery-electric replacement. The airport equipment will operate in Missoula County, which is a priority area identified in DEQ's Beneficiary Mitigation Plan. The equipment operates in an area that has high levels of PM-2.5 pollution, and diesel PM pollution when compared with the rest of Montana.

### Estimate of Anticipated NOx Reductions (5.2.3)

Montana DEQ estimated NOx emission reductions using the Alternative Fuel Life-Cycle Environmental and Economic Transportation (AFLEET) Tool provided by Argonne National Laboratories (<a href="https://greet.es.anl.gov/afleet">https://greet.es.anl.gov/afleet</a>). We calculated reductions for each of the pieces of airport equipment using the provided fuel type, usage, and replacement fuel. We estimate total reductions in NOx emissions of 183 pounds total over five years.

### Describe how the Beneficiary will make documentation publicly available (5.2.7.2)

### Describe any cost-share requirement to be placed on each NOx source proposed to be mitigated (5.2.8):

Airport equipment purchased by government airport authorities were eligible for reimbursement up to 70% of the cost of each new piece of equipment. MSO will receive a maximum of \$47,804.40 for replacement of one baggage tractor with a new all-electric model and the charging infrastructure associated with the new equipment. MSO's estimated cost share will be 30% with a total purchase price expected to be \$68,292.00.

If applicable, describe how the mitigation action will mitigate the impacts of NOx emissions on communities that have historically borne a disproportionate share of the adverse impacts of such emissions (5.2.10)

The baggage tractor funded by this request will replace older gasoline equipment operating in Missoula County. Missoula County is identified in Montana's Beneficiary Mitigation Plan as a priority county based on annual mobile sources of nonroad NOx emissions. Missoula County is also one of the top counties for registrations of the offending Volkswagen diesel vehicles.

This funding request will provide advance funds to the Montana Department of Environmental Quality (MTDEQ) for the implementation of airport ground support equipment replacements under the Montana Clean Truck, Bus & Airport Equipment Program Round 2.
