Within 90 days of USFWS issuance of final guidance regarding Northern Long-eared bats, the permittee in consultation with DEQ, shall evaluate the need to revise the following wildlife plans to align with federal endangered species requirements: Fish and Wildlife Plan (17.24.312), Protection & Enhancement of Fish, Wildlife, & Related Environmental Values (17.24.751), Monitoring Plan (17.24.723). If updates to wildlife plans are deemed necessary, the permittee must submit those updates in a Minor Revision within 180 days of USFWS issuance of final guidance.

## Reason

The United States Fish and Wildlife Service noted in communication with interested parties (which includes DEQ) on March 11, 2024 that guidance for the Northern Long-eared Bat would be released at a later date and permittees should determine if they need to assess whether modifications to their wildlife plan is required once the final guidance has been issued.

A check of OSM's Applicant Violator System (AVS) was completed on 3/20/2024; no problems were identified that would preclude issuance of the permit.
