Comprehensive Bond Review for Magris Talc USA, Inc. (Hard Rock Mining Operating Permit No. 00075)

The Montana Department of Environmental Quality (DEQ) is conducting a comprehensive bond review for Operating Permit No. 00075 issued to Magris at the Beaverhead Mine. The facility and associated disturbances are located in Section 14, Township 7 South, Range 6 West, in Madison County. The site is about 23 miles southwest of Alder, MT on Department of Interior, Bureau of Land Management land. The site consists of a total of about 159 acres of which about 98.7 acres have been disturbed, but less than 2 acres remain unreclaimed and bonded.

DEQ has determined that the current bonding level does not represent the present costs of compliance with the Metal Mine Reclamation Act, administrative rules adopted thereunder, and the operating permit. DEQ is proposing a bond increase of \$66,188 (from \$109,095 to \$175,283). The bond increase is largely due to changes in fuel price and equipment rates, costs for completing the reclamation and revegetation of a bioswale channel, and updated indirect costs.

The procedure for adjusting bonds as a result of a comprehensive bond review is set forth in Section 82-4-338(3), MCA. The permittee and the public will have until April 20, 2026, to comment on the proposed bond increase. DEQ will issue a final bond determination after the comment period has expired. The permittee, or any person with an interest that may be adversely affected by DEQ's final bond determination, may obtain a contested case hearing before the Board of Environmental Review. A written request for a hearing must be filed with DEQ within 30 days of the issuance of the final bond determination, stating the reason for the request.
