- ❖ Approve minutes from October 17<sup>th</sup>, 2024, meeting
  - Jim looked at minutes, didn't see anything of concern as he wasn't at the meeting. Motion to approve, seconded. All in favor, motion carried.
- Solid Waste Section Updates
  - Staff assignments, hiring, office changes Fred Collins
    - Tim Stepp, engineer, retired in December. Looking at engineer hiring in February 2025. Direct engineering projects to Solid Waste inbox.

- Fully staffed otherwise
- Solid Waste Program moved offices to 1225 Cedar St Helena MT 59601
- Jim Simon has a question about Tim's review of a project closure
- Trainings Fred Collins
  - Blue Ridge Services winter webinars. Industrial storm water training June 2025 – in person?
  - Fred will fill calendar of trainings in Feb. 2025.
  - Dusti and Fred will try to do a composting training. Butcher waste.
  - Reach out to Fred with ideas for training to get it on the calendar.
- Project statuses Fred Collins
  - Lincoln County license expansion went out.
  - Deer Lodge expansion EA to be published in February.
  - Flathead county expanded EA drafted, to be put in the new format, then sent to MEPA/legal team. Second or third week in Feb for publication.
  - Transfer station license application in from Gallatin County. End of 2025 at the earliest. Preliminary work at site, survey, traffic survey etc.
- o Inspections Madeline Marchiafava
  - 63 inspections competed in 2024, almost double of 2023
  - 19 minor violations and 5 major violations
  - Violations include windblown litter, fences need to be cleaned, dust.
- Materials Management Program Brady Christiansen and Dusti Johnson
  - Brady Christensen JV licenses renewals, waiting on payments for 2. 124 will be licensed in 2025. Some have closed and 1 will not be renewed due to noncompliance.
  - Dusti Johnson focused on grant, a year and a half into a grant. Megan has been helping a lot. Still looking into the battery situation. Still doing collection events – funding is an issue but hope to acquire more grants. Quite a few projects listed, Dusti will put it in next SWAC meeting. Compost training.
- Enforcement Garett Masin
  - Complaints 24 complaints. 6 asbestos, 1
- Andrea 161 license renewals to send out.
- Other Items

- Legislative Updates Fred
  - Vehicle titling that won't affect us too much, Fred will reach out if anything comes up. Rick is keeping an eye on things.
- PFAS Updates Madeline
  - No regulatory requirements
  - Drafts will be sent out for public comment
  - Waste water treatment plants biosolids
  - EPA recommends monitoring sludge pretreatment
  - Revisions to effluent limit guidelines
  - 9 more PFAS added to list
  - Fred will reach out with legislative action on PFAS.

## Lithium-ion batteries

- Jacki busy! Call To Recycle One Drum recycle kit with 4 55-gallon drums with bioresistant granules, batteries go in, and layer goes over. 3<sup>rd</sup> barrel filled since October 2024. Utility bills insert in Nov 2024 for Lithium-ion awareness and sustainability newsletter. Fred asked what batteries have been coming in the most, Jacki says rechargeable drill/hand tool batteries, and cell phone and laptop batteries. Kyle asked how much disposal is costing Helena \$1500 and costs \$600-700 to ship out. \$2200 altogether. Detailed reports will come in as soon as barrels ship out and get recycled. All 4 drums will go out at the same time.
- Dusti reiterated what Jacki said. Batteries aren't considered Universal Waste. Hazardous Waste should come to the next meeting and talk about recycling/disposal of batteries. Landfills > recyclers > broken down (Universal waste)

  - Fred talked with Bevin McCormick regarding CWD, no legislative action as of this time.
- Open SWAC positions

  - Small Western Class II Landfill (e.g., Deer Lodge) Fred will reach out in invites for next SWAC meeting.
