- Introductions
- Discussion and approval of minutes
  - ➤ The April 11, 2019, minutes were not finalized
- Solid Waste Section updates
  - Staff Assignments Rick Thompson
    - o Tim on leave Weds 7/17 thru early Sept
    - O SW Program 2 positions short
    - o Mike Eder assuming hydrogeology duties
  - ➤ Solid Waste Training Update Fred Collins/Rick Thompson
    - MOLO Aug. 26-30 holiday Inn Express, capped at 25 people FRED send brochures next week
    - o 24hr HAZWOPER in Bozeman end of Sept/early Oct w/ Tony Olson
    - o Winter webinar in Feb Fred will call for topics
    - May/June 2020 compost training in Missoula due to proximity of composting facilities
    - June/July 2020 storm water pollution prevention plan training. This may become an annual training.
  - > TENORM rules status update Emily Ewart
    - Re-shared draft rules with the workgroup in June for further input. Meet w/ director tomorrow.
    - Will notice the rules and have 2 public hearings: one in Glendive, and one most likely in Helena.
    - Rules were re-organized and streamlined compared to the rules noticed in 2017.
  - Licensing Rick Thompson
    - o Class IV Libby expansion EPA phasing out operations & county taking over
    - o Class III Program working on an EIS
    - o Several STP land application site EAs being worked on
  - ➤ Inspections Rick Thompson
    - o No update
  - Materials Management Brady Christensen
    - Dusti Johnson won food waste challenge award from EPA region 8
    - JV director training was May 15 Billings
    - o FY18 audits for county JV grants are being done
      - 6 done, 7 in progress, 19 planned
    - o Recycled about 12 tons e-waste

# Renewal Forms – Rick Thompson & Andrea Staley

- Program is considering whether to use one renewal form or use different forms for different types of facilities.
- Suggestion to include directions on current form
- > The words "solid waste facility" on the applications creates issues with local governments/zoning

# • Green Team update - Dianna Robinson

- Director requested DEQ attain zero waste within 2 years
- > Green team plans to have completed waste audits and characterization by this fall

#### Asbestos – Mark Hall/ENFD

- Jenny introduced herself
- Asbestos Advisory Group recommendations
  - o Increase fees
    - Sent out notice
    - 3 stakeholder meetings
    - Formal announcement end of month & finalize in September or October
  - o Increase compliance
    - Fee increase could allow more staff which would increase compliance
    - Program can access state building permit applications they reach out w/ regulations. Seems to have generated more calls to program.
- > Asbestos/SW/ENFD programs coordinating more
  - Discussing violation significance criteria making sure people know what it will mean to them if they violate the statute
- ➤ Chad, ENFD they get about 50 asbestos complaints/year and their program helps resolve/meet compliance
- Rick Thompson some complaints re: landfills mismanaging asbestos. He asked the committee if asbestos waste has increased, and for feedback re: why complaints are increasing.
  - o Lake County doesn't accept asbestos. People can't afford inspections.
  - o waste not being screened properly
  - How can DEQ know how operators are complying, can DEQ get knowledge of operations/practices
  - o Homeowners bringing unregulated asbestos-containing materials
  - Operator heard that contractors aren't complying; then operator is held responsible for improper handling. Operators can't enforce asbestos regulations.
  - Public can't afford asbestos inspections

- Contractors come and go quickly so it's difficult to educate them.
   Unscrupulous contractors don't follow laws.
- Gallatin requests patrons to declare it; those who do feel it's unfair because not everybody does
- o Counties don't have regulations re: asbestos inspections
- 1800 cars/day, semis from Wyoming facilities can't inspect every load-e.g., samples sent out of state to specialized labs how can entry staff verify asbestos in a load or not?
- Butte when notified of an asbestos-containing load it's handled appropriately. They cannot account for asbestos-containing loads if they aren't notified. Becoming a liability to accept it if facility is accountable
- o Jenny we're trying to figure out how to pre-empt bad loads
- o City governments it's working, unincorporated/counties is where it's a problem. E.g., Bozeman it really works
  - Consider outreach to city & county public works directors, mayors, administrative staff
  - MACo could train, MT league of cities and towns
- o DEQ website information isn't accessible

# Per & Polyfluoroalkyl Substances (PFAS) – Patrick Skibicki

- Does not occur naturally
  - o There are 3,000-5,000 compounds labs can only look for 20-30
- > EPA created advisories for drinking water levels in 2016
- Malmstrom and air national guard in GF tested for and found them
- Landfills, waste water treatment plants, and bio-application sites have lots of them
- > DEQ has a workgroup developing a statewide plan
- DEQ headed toward screening to determine if and where the impacts are occurring
   Can we get \$, find sites, do some testing
- > Other agencies in MT are working on it
- Congress has allotted \$ to EPA

- > any SW fee updates? No, not prioritized right now.
- ➤ Gallatin County Jim May record-breaking, 400-600 vehicles/day, Lots of construction. 30-35% C & D wastes, it's a big percentage of the growth
- Matt E 406 helping at music festivals and events, and busy w/ electronics
- > Brian Hohn Jefferson County expanding at new canister site
- ➤ Bob Church Sanders Co transfer station 1/3 done operational by Nov

- Travis Sanders Co transfer station, looking at regional trans station in Gallatin County
- > Stephanie Dave expansion, Gallatin expansion, Title V reporting
- ➤ Glen switched to charge by ton and no-tarp fee working great. Hasn't reduced highway litter as much as they thought
