Project or Application: Stillwater Mine; MPDES permit number MT0024716

Description of Project: This is for the renewal of a wastewater discharge permit for the Stillwater Mine. Discharge is to the Stillwater River. See accompanying permit and fact sheet for effluent limits, monitoring requirements, and compliance requirements.

Benefits and Purpose of Proposal: The permit was developed to ensure mine drainage discharged to the Stillwater River and ground water complies with the water quality-standards for pollutants of concern.

Description and analysis of reasonable alternatives whenever alternatives are reasonably available and prudent to consider: None at this time. A permit may only be denied or terminated for cause as provided in ARM 17.30.1363. Cause for termination include: noncompliance by the permittee with any permit condition; the permittee failure in the application or during the permit issuance process to fully disclose all relevant facts, or the permittee's misrepresentation of any relevant facts at any time; a determination that the permittee's activity endangers human health or the environmental and can only be regulated to an acceptable level by permit modification or termination; or a change in any condition that requires either a temporary or a permanent reduction or elimination of any discharge controlled by the permit. None of these situations are applicable.
