NOTICE OF PUBLICATION OF CATEGORICAL EXCLUSION CITY OF RED LODGE, MONTANA 16-INCH BYPASS LINE PROJECT

The Montana Department of Environmental Quality has reviewed the above-named project. The Red Lodge 16-inch Bypass Line Project consists of installing approximately 3,370 lineal feet of 16-inch PVC water main to bypass the existing pressure reducing valve on White Avenue South, including all associated temporary water, appurtenances and surface repair. The project also includes the removal of booster pumps located in a utility building and installing a new pressure reducing system in the same utility building. The new 16-inch water line will be installed along White Avenue South between the Carbon County Shop building and South Airport Road. The utility building is located near the intersection of Lazy M Street and US Highway 78. The proposed project is needed to address low pressure problems in a portion of Red Lodge's water service area.

Pursuant to ARM 17.40.318, the Department has concluded that the proposed project meets the Categorical Exclusion criteria of the National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA) and the Montana Environmental Policy Act (MEPA).


