

NOTICE OF PUBLICATION OF CATEGORICAL EXCLUSION HARRISON WATER & SEWER DISTRICT WPCSRF #: C304263 Phase 1 Wastewater System Improvements

October 9, 2025

The Harrison Water and Sewer District, through a 2024 Wastewater System Improvements Preliminary Engineering Report (PER), analyzed the condition of its wastewater collection and treatment system components. The PER identified that high groundwater in the area causes extreme inflow and infiltration I&I into the sewer collection system, which results in excessive pumping at the lift station, increased flow and reduced detention time at the lagoons, and increased land application requirements. The PER identified the need for lift station upgrades, sludge removal in lagoon Cell #1, repair or replacement of worn lagoon liners, increasing lagoon capacity, increasing irrigation area, and irrigation system upgrades. The 2024 PER recommended that the project be separated into two phases. This Categorical Exclusion is being issued to address and publicly notice the Phase 1 work. The project comprises rehabilitation of one manhole; rehabilitation of 460 feet of sewer main with Cured-In-Place Pipe (CIPP); one pipe spot repair prior to CIPP; replacement of two sewer service connections; cleaning, jetting, and camera inspection of 725 feet of sewer mains; rehabilitation and sealing of the lift station wet well; and installation of a flow meter and new valving in the lift station enclosure. A future Phase 2 project will consist of upgrades to the wastewater treatment lagoons and irrigation system. The project will protect public health, safety, and the environment by ensuring safe and reliable conveyance of wastewater to the treatment lagoons.

Pursuant to ARM 17.40.318, the Department has concluded that the proposed project meets the Categorical Exclusion criteria of the National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA) and the Montana Environmental Policy Act (MEPA). The Categorical Exclusion may be revoked if the project is not initiated within the time period specified in the facility plan, a new or modified application is submitted, new evidence demonstrates serious local or environmental issues exist, or state, local, tribal, or federal laws are violated.


